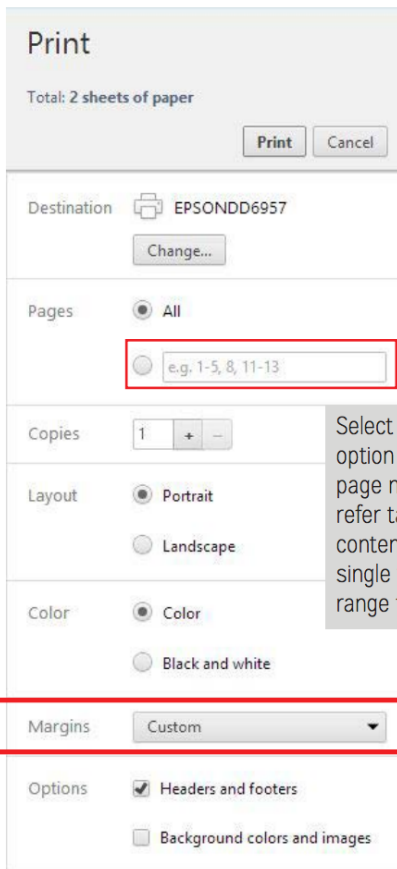
If you have a pretty good vocabulary and are looking to round it out even more, these visual vocab cards of **16 common yet difficult GRE words** may be exactly what you need!

GRE Visual Vocab Flashcards: One-Sided Printing Instructions

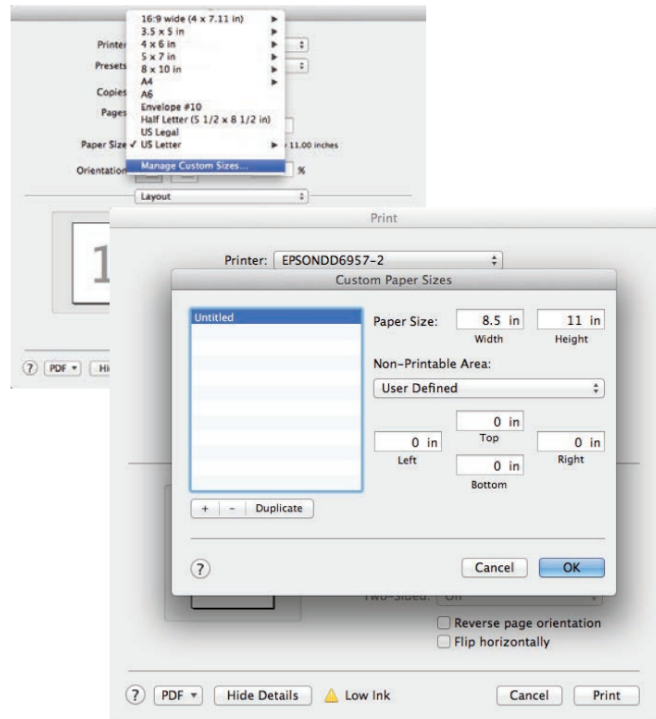
Pro Tip: Flashcards printed single-sided on regular paper + a guillotine paper cutter + a laminator = an awesome set of GRE Visual Vocab Flashcards!
(Flashcards are found on pages 5-20.)



Select the second option to specify page numbers and refer table of contents under single for the page range to print.

Print using system dialog... (Ctrl+Shift+P)

Keep default print options. If your printer allows for printing without margins, change them to **0**. Otherwise, change margins to **0.5 inches** for top and bottom and **0.25 inches** for left and right.



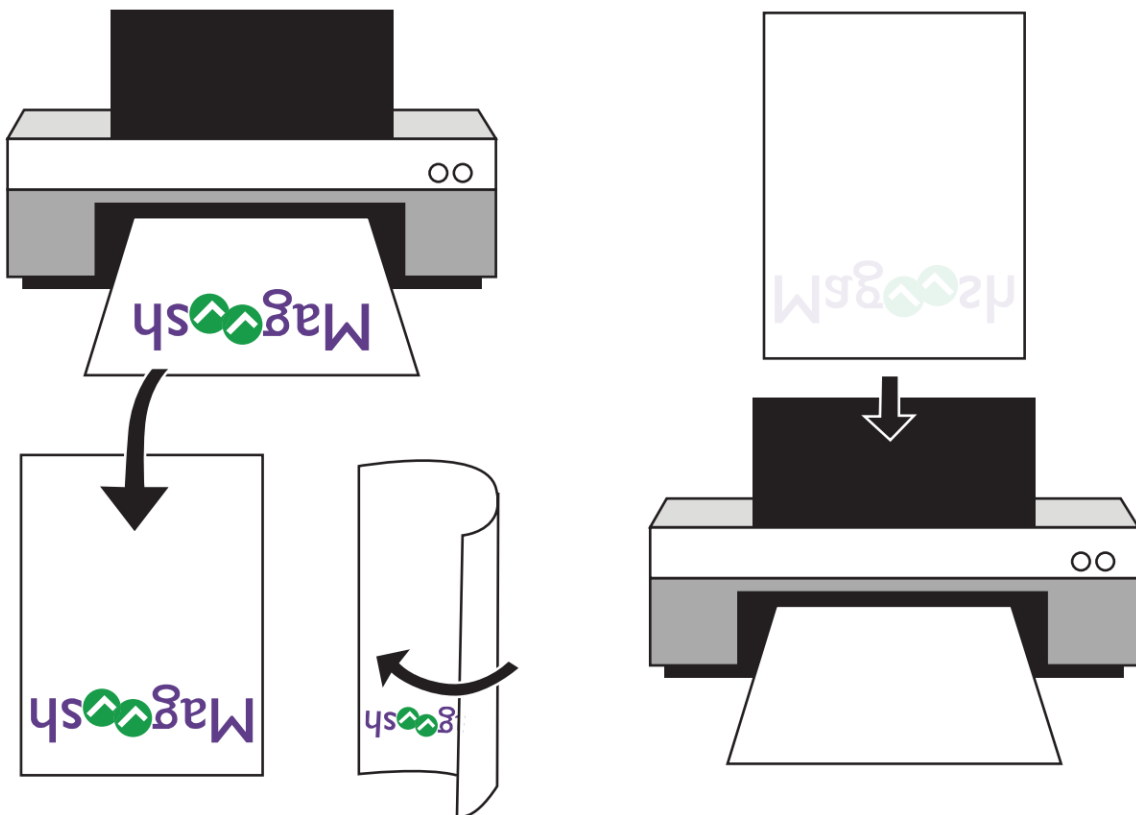
Under the print dialog, keep the default settings but click on the dropdown next to paper size. Select "manage custom sizes". In the new dialog, click the plus button on the left side and enter the above numbers in the blanks. If your printer does not allow 0 margins, put **0.5 in** for top and bottom and **0.25 in** for left and right.

GRE Visual Vocab Flashcards: Two-Sided Printing Instructions

If your printer allows for two-sided printing, make sure margins are set to zero and then select two-sided printing option **along the long side** (flashcards are found on pages 5-20).

If you can only do double sided printing manually, follow these instructions:

1. Consider using card stock paper to prevent the ink from bleeding through and a guillotine paper cutter for the best results.
2. Follow the instructions on the previous page to change the margins to zero.
3. When the printer prints out the page, pick up the printed page exactly as it came out from the printer, **then flip it around by its long side** (not the short side!). Place the page back in the paper slot/tray for the printer with the blank side up.
4. In the print dialogue, change the page number to be of the next page in the flashcard set. After the second page is printed, print the third page on a new piece of paper and repeat.

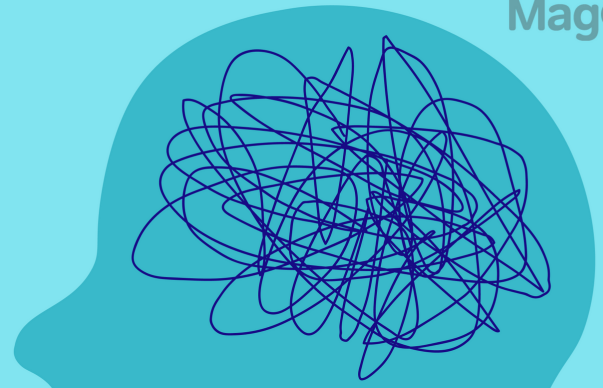

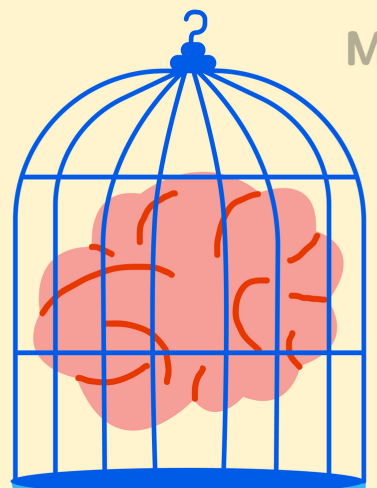

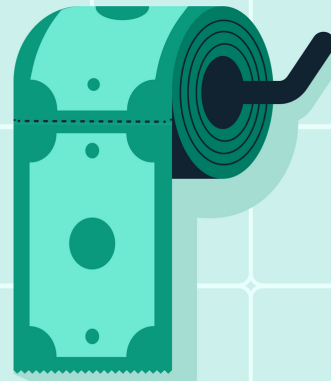
